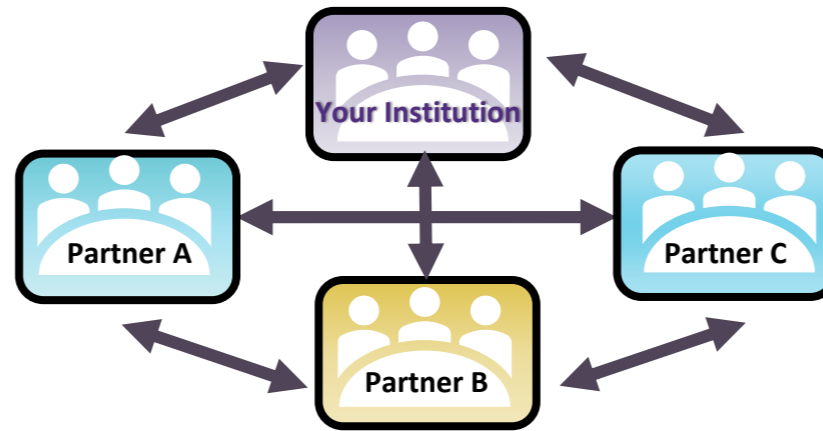

## One of 4 Global BEEHIVE Courses

- ❖ Modeled after the award-winning Global Understanding Course.
- ❖ Developed in collaboration with partner institutions in Chile, China, The Netherlands and the US.

The Global Education course explores education systems, beliefs, and practices, through a comparative education lens. Students explore various topics about schools and schooling by both reflecting on their own experience and inquiring into the educational experiences of their global counterparts. Topics discussed during the collaborative portions of the course include the funding of education, educational equity, assessment and testing, and classroom management. Students then work together on collaborative projects focused on identifying and **advocacy** for best practices for educational policy.
