



Student Voices

Student Characteristics

- Students from 33 universities in 20 countries took the GU survey
- 1127 students
- 480 (43%) only pretest
- 127 (11%) only posttest
- 520 (46%) both pretest & posttest
- Sometimes students not taking survey at all
- Sometimes taking wrong survey (e.g., take pretest at end of links)
- Important for students to take correct version (different Qs)



Student Characteristics

- 92% first GU course
- 63% had visited or lived in foreign countries
 - 37% NO international travel experience
 - 34% less than 30 days



Cultural Intelligence (CQ)

BEHAVIOR (ACTION)

- adapting behavior to fit different cultural contexts
- e.g., adjusting verbal & nonverbal communication

MOTIVATION (DRIVE)

- level of curiosity & desire to learn about other cultures
- Persistence & confidence when multicultural situation is ambiguous or challenging

COGNITION (KNOWLEDGE)

understanding how cultures are similar & different (knowing values & norms)


METACOGNITION (STRATEGY)

awareness, checking, and planning for multicultural interactions



Cultural Intelligence (CQ)

- Significant PRE-POST INCREASES in all areas of cultural intelligence
- Student perceptions of change matched changes in CQ scores:
- "How would you rate your capability to function effectively in diverse settings..."





Cultural Intelligence (CQ)

- After GU course, CQ significantly correlated with:
- Greater understanding of different perspectives
- Feeling less anxious & more competent interacting with strangers from a different culture
- Less stressed about living in a foreign country
- Stronger interest in international news, travel, and study abroad
- Learned more and more satisfied with GU course



Communication

- After taking GU course
- 72% feel MORE COMPETENT interacting with strangers from a different culture
- 79% feel LESS ANXIOUS or FEARFUL interacting with strangers from a different culture



Students should take this course thanks to the possibility to improve their oral expression. Moreover, they could also improve their capacity to meet new people. I think this course is profitable either for shy people or enterprising people. I admit that it is not easy to speak without stress in front of all the class. Nevertheless, in private with the international partner it's easier to speak about diverse topics. This course allowed me to meet wonderful people, learn more about their culture and become more confident.

Communication

- Intercultural contact outside of class time matters
- Higher satisfaction with amount of contact GU students had with partners outside of class STRONGLY CORRELATED with:
- Higher CQ scores
- Stronger understanding of different perspectives
- Greater learning about countries and cultures
- Higher overall course satisfaction




Friendship

- Students who developed friendship w/partner VS no friendships:
 - Higher CQ scores
 - Better understanding different perspectives
 - Learned more about countries & cultures
 - Greater effort to continue learning
 - More interested in international news, travel, & study abroad
 - More satisfied w/course and partner interactions
